Judge Morrison C. England, Jr.

Judge Morrison C. England, Jr. was nominated by President George W. Bush to the position of United States District Court Judge, Eastern District of California on March 21, 2002. He was confirmed by the United States Senate to that position on August 1, 2002, received his commission and assumed the office on August 2, 2002.

Judge England was previously appointed by Governor Pete Wilson as a Sacramento County Municipal Court Judge on August 7, 1996. Governor Wilson elevated him to the Sacramento County Superior Court on August 22, 1997. His Superior Court assignment was as a General Trial Court, which handled both criminal and civil matters. This assignment included Civil Writs and the Accelerated Civil Trial (ACT Program). Judge England also spent time in the Juvenile Division of the Superior Court handling both dependency and delinquency matters.

He began law school at McGeorge School of Law where he graduated with a juris doctorate degree in 1983. He passed the California Bar Exam in 1983 and eventually became a partner of the law firm of Quattrin, Johnson, Campora & England. Additionally, England served for three years as a member of the Executive Board of the California Judge’s Association as the representative for Sacramento and San Joaquin counties. He is a Master of the Bench and President of the Anthony M. Kennedy Inn of Court, McGeorge School of Law. Judge England was also a member of the Judge Advocate General’s Corp for the United States Army Reserve and held the rank of Major.
